Sharks K-W-L Chart

ANCHOR

ACTIVATE BACKGROUND KNOWLEDGE

Point to the first column of the Shark K-W-L Chart.

SAY

We are going to read an article about sharks. There are also some pictures with facts about sharks. Before we read, we will answer two questions. First, what do you Know about sharks?

Pause for student responses and list them under the first column.

You already know a lot about sharks!

Point to the second column of the Shark K-W-L Chart.

Next, what do you Want to know about sharks?

Pause for student responses and list them under the second column.

Those are some great questions!

Point to the third column of the Shark K-W-L Chart.

SAY

We are going to read an article about sharks. Then, you will answer the third question: What did you Learn about sharks?



PURPOSE STATEMENT

Today, we will read to learn more about sharks. Let's read to:

- Check our facts

Point to the first column.

- Try to answer our questions.




Point to the second column.

- Share what we learned about sharks.

Point to the third column.

Pass out **Articles**.

ARTICLES



READ

As a whole group, read the **Article with a Sidebar**. Have student volunteers read words or labels where possible. Support students in reading.

APPLY



We learned more about sharks by reading an article. What facts did we learn? Did we answer all of our questions? How could we find out more about sharks? Do you have any other questions about sharks? Take your article home so you can talk about it with your family or friends!
